In the last decade...

1,453 Men and Women have died as a result of workplace injury or disease.

In the last five years...

Workplace injury and disease has resulted in the payment of 721,766 claims.

Last year ...

More than 3.6 million days of work were lost to short term disability and disease

Today...


Another 700 injuries will occur.

14 will result in a permanent disability.

This hour...

34 workers will suffer a lost time injury.



OHSMS Performance Success

- <u>USA</u> Injury Rates 50% Industry Average (VPP)
- UK Fatal Rate Reduction 2 fold since 1988

 Companies 30-300% In accident rates
- Germany Accident Rates 1/3 of industry average
- Australia SafetyMAP Survey results
 - 79% improved overall OHS performance
 - 91% improved employee involvement in OHS
 - 76% improved OHS performance of contractors




USA - VPP 1999 Summary

- 140 industries 517 participants
- Injury rates 50% industry average
- WC costs 4 90% in 4 years (Alumax, Arkansas)
- Injury rate fell from 6.5 2.6 (Hoechst, Celanese)
- Illness rates \$\overline{1}\$ 66% in 1 year (International Paper)
- Intel EHSMS (based on ISO 14001)
 - Worldwide injuries 4 fold
 - Contractor Injury Rate 12 fold
