



Eastern Ontario Model Forest

1.5 million hectares

88% of forests are privately owned

Home to over 1 million people

Represents the Great Lakes - St. Lawrence Forest Region

34 % Forest cover - Hardwood Dominant


25% of Ontario's Maple Syrup Production in EOMF



What is Forest Certification?

- Provides 3rd-party verification that forest management practices comply with established standards
- A voluntary, market based program to give consumers choice
- Recognizes good forest management

- A Credible Forest Certification System

- Canadian Standards Association (CSA)
- Sustainable Forest Initiative (SFI)
- Pan Canadian System (in Progress)
- International Standards Organization (ISO)





Forest Stewardship Council

- Formed in 1993 in response to consumers' concerns
- International, non-profit, NGO
- Has certified 700 forests in 54 countries
- Has draft Standards in place for the GLSL region






FSC Principles & Criteria

- 1. Meet all applicable laws
- 2. Have legally established rights
- 3. Respect Indigenous Peoples rights
- 4. Maintain community well-being
- 5. Conserve economic resources
- 6. Protect biological diversity
- 7. A written management plan
- 8. Regular monitoring
- 9. Maintain high conservation value forests
- 10. Manage plantations to reduce pressures on natural forests

Evidence of long-term forest rights to land (title, lease agreement)


Indicator #2


