B. Competency Based

NATIONAL OCCUPATIONAL STANDARDS (NOS)

Used to assess environmental skills and knowledge

- Developed through extensive consultation process
- Define the skills & knowledge required for proficiency within each distinct area of environmental employment
- Provide common benchmark for proficiency
- Basis for the Sub-Sector model



C. Consent to Ethical Practice

- Certification recipients must consent to abide by the CECAB Code of Ethics, which addresses:
 - Responsible practice, ethics & professionalism
 - Regard for health and safety
 - Continuous maintenance of competencies

The Code of Ethics is enforced by the CECAB Disciplinary Committee

4. CEAA Partnership



CEAA Partnership

Partnership between the Canadian Council for Human Resources in the Environment Industry (CCHREI) and the Canadian Environmental Auditing Association (CEAA) to manage auditing certification processes via CECAB's webbased application system.

- 3. Centralized environmental certification in Canada



Current Application System

The current application process for CEA, CEA (SFM) and CEAS includes:

- Initial On-line Application
- Audit or Assessment Log Entry
- Submission of documentation
- CECAB Registrar Review
- Panel Review
- Written Examination*
- CEAA Board Approval*

- Evidence of Formal Auditing Course training
- Certificate of insurance
- Academic Transcripts
- Copies of membership certificates
