Simple advice based on my experience:

1) Assess your range of skills that are transferable; (know what you bring to the audit table).

2) Pursue subsequent certification

It is important to realize that auditing has standards, procedures and protocol that need to be applied consistently. Certification indicates that you have training that enhances your existing subject matter expertise.
